Preface

The goal of the Student Papers Program is to encourage students to attend ISSRE and present their work, exchange ideas with researchers and practitioners, and get early feedback on their research efforts.

Student papers are short technical articles that promote early communication of technical work and allow students to report on work in progress and introduce new ideas to the community. Student papers should not exceed 6 pages of dual column IEEE Style. The first author of the paper must be a student. Submissions must be unpublished and must not be submitted for publication elsewhere.

Student papers are reviewed by the members of the Student Papers Program Committee. The selection is based on the following criteria:

- Relevance to the theme of the conference
- Originality
- Technical soundness
- Quality and clarity of the written presentation.

This year's program features 11 papers (selected from 23 submissions). We hope that this year's presentations stimulate much thought and cross-pollination and make the exchange experience enjoyable.
